Ft. Leavenworth JRIC and Emerging Threats Program

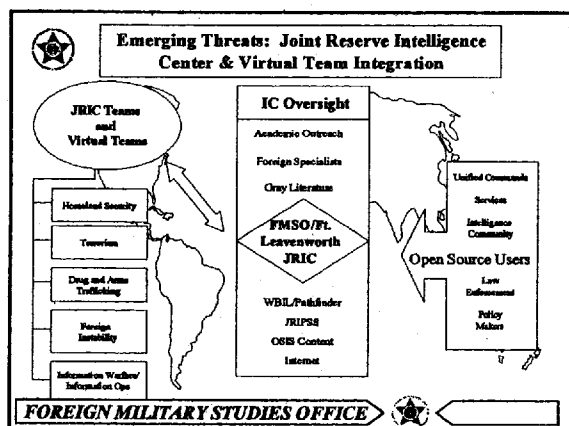
- FMSO designation as a Joint Reserve Intelligence Center (JRIC) at Ft. Leavenworth, KS on 10 January 2001
- Incorporates and consolidates FMSO IC programs using Joint Reservists
- Uses existing all-source connectivity/facilities with additional enhancements as feasible
- Utilizes regional Joint RC personnel and units for focused research and production
- Products and data bases directly accessible to Army, IC, CINCs, Services, DoD agencies, and Federal Law Enforcement

Emerging Threats Program Overview

- Establish Emerging Threat analysis, production, and data base development Centers of Excellence with emphasis on Open Sources
- Use Joint RC Intelligence personnel working at JRICs (initially Phoenix); Integrate with Joint RC virtual teams already operating in US & abroad; incorporate other OSINT cells (DoD, LEA, etc.)
- Task to produce assessments and filtered data
- Focus research, analysis, & production on:
 - Asymmetric, transnational, and other emerging threats
 - Includes info War & Operations, Homeland Security, Terrorism, Drug and Arms Trafficking, Foreign Instability and others)

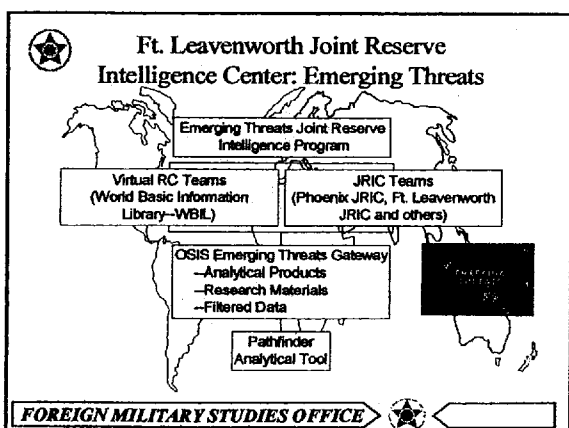

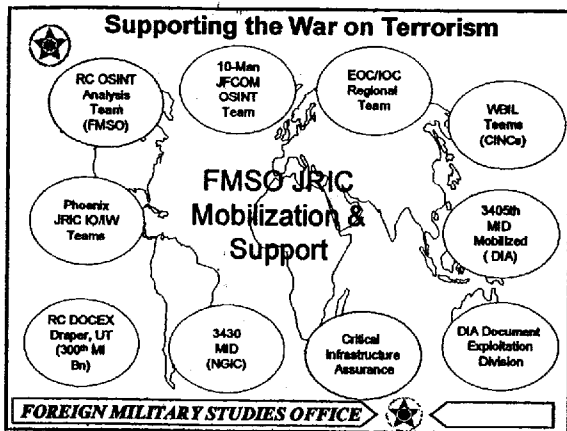


JRIC Analytical Teams Focus

- JRIC Programs: Broadened intelligence support to national, regional, and local military/interagency communities. Information requirements for:
 - Threat data—organized militaries, militias, paramilitaries, and other armed groups with their affiliations
 - NGOs and other analogous organizations
 - Bio-graphic data on "selected" individuals of interest
 - Cultural intelligence (customs, mores, demographics, tribal relationships, ethnicity, political leanings, religions, history)
 - Governmental information—type, personalities, structure, etc.
 - Infrastructure—roads, ports, airfields, electrical power grid structure, communications, health/sanitation infrastructure
 - Medical intelligence—endemic disease, sanitation, health facilities, poisonous animals/plants, etc; and
 - Economic intelligence—major economic sectors and their structure.

JFCOM OSINT CELL

- 10-person RC OSINT Cell at FMSO
- Direct support to JFCOM Homeland Security Command by Emerging Threats/WBIL
- "WBIL shall provide support for USJFCOM HLSC in the area of unclassified Internet search and data base development for
 - Open source analysis and data mining
 - Coordinated information operations assessment
 - Critical infrastructure analysis from open sources
- Focus on "red" perceptions, US vulnerabilities and critical infrastructure protection; media reporting on US military activities; and other issues

War on Terrorism—Analytical Programs

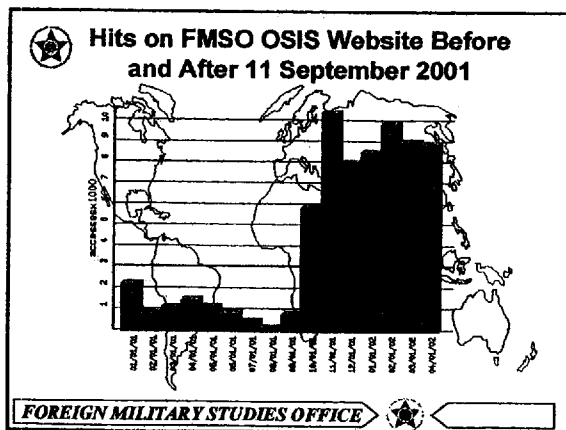
- Afghan Operational Environment
 - Community wide book & study distribution
 - Briefings to senior leaders
 - Special assessments for senior leaders
- Other Regions
 - Tri-border Region (Argentina, Paraguay, Brazil) research team
 - Colombia research team (with DIA)
 - Philippines and Indonesia (assessments)
 - Iran/Iraq (assessments)
 - US Southwest and Northern Borders

War on Terrorism—Analytical Programs (cont.)

- Critical Infrastructure Assurance Project (CIAP)
 - Analyzes attempted computer intrusions into national critical infrastructure computer networks
 - Strong National Interagency Participation
 - FBI Field Office and Resident Agents
 - Corporate security officers & CEOs of Critical Infrastructure Providers
 - Local Police and Emergency Organizations
 - Supported by mobilized RC personnel at JRIC
 - Briefed to national IC and interagency organizations—continued intense interest.
