VHS Video #1, "Executive Excerpts (Policy)" is a 45-minute presentation with captioned introductions, and includes carefully selected excerpts from Steele, Studeman, Strassmann, Rheingold, Barlow, Holden-Rhodes, and Donahue.

VHS Video #2, "Video Proceedings", is an eight-tape series providing the entire substantive content of the symposium less Anderson, Andriole, and Nobel (technical loss, their presentations are in Volume II). Speakers have been shuffled on tapes to create two hour groupings for overview, defense, government, technical policy, technical practice, radical change, and financial/political (the Hill panel is not Volume II).
